Daniel was born in Camarillo, California in May 1994. Daniel lived with his dad, mom and brother (14) before coming to Trail House. Daniel has lived in several different states, including Georgia, Virginia, Missouri, Idaho, California, and of course Washington.

Daniel loved going to school since the first day he got to get on the school bus. He even closed the door behind him so that his parents couldn't make him get off. Daniel loves going shopping, to the doctors and dentist, and church, but he doesn't like walking very far at all.

Daniel has a very large extended family, mostly living in the Greater Los Angeles area. Daniel is very gregarious, affectionate, and loves attention. Daniel only uses 10 or so vocal words, but has a very large "functional sign" set. Daniel's mother says that his comprehension level is around college age.

He lived in the Greater Los Angeles area until his mom had a business opportunity to move to Washington in 2005. Daniel and his family lived in Greater Spokane until June 2014. Daniel attended North Pines Middle School, Barker High School, East Valley High School, and Shadle Park High School. Each school had an amazing special needs program. At East Valley HS, the Differentiated Instruction (DI) students were given the opportunity to learn to garden. Daniel got to participate in the DI softball league when he attended Shadle Park. Daniel was in a self-inclusive classes and was growing and learning. He attended school until last year. Daniel and his family moved to Whidbey Island in July 2014. While they lived in Greenbank, they were unable to find any programs for him.

Daniel's family was looking for programs that would benefit Daniel and expand his horizons. Daniel's mom and dad have medical problems that are affecting them more and made it more difficult to care for Daniel. They were able to have the DDA get him approved for an Adult Family Home, but after many calls and visits, they just weren't enough for Daniel and his needs. When he was approved for a CORE waiver, they were extremely happy that Trail House had an opening, and it has been a perfect fit.

Daniel loves living at Trail House. He has been with us for almost 3 months. He attended Camp Lake Retreat and loved it. He has been on many outings. The Family at Helping Hands are so pleased that he is with us and will continue the next step on his journey as part of Helping Hands. We can't wait to see how much he will continued to grow with us!
