Hometown Hero: **Eva Robinson**

Eva Robinson was nominated by HHD for the KIRO "Hometown Hero" Award, and she won! Eva Robinson has inspired me and so many others before me. She's worked for HHD for 33 years now. The residents love her and look forward to her coming to work every day. She has devoted her life to helping those who are in need. She cares for them, makes sure the homes are safe, and provides support to the agency during all her working hours.

In combination with caring for the residents of the DD community, she has been a foster parent for over 25 years and has adopted a son who is developmentally disabled. She has taken many children into her home and taught them their worth. Eva has made a temporary home for many children who were not cared for by anyone else; she often receives calls for children in need of emergency foster care. She is asked to provide quality care for high profile or high risk children. She inspires these children to be the best versions of themselves. Currently, there are four foster children in her care. She also volunteers extensively with The Boys and Girls Club and local schools.

Including her work with humans, Eva has rescued and cared for a surplus of animals over the years. She has two dogs (one is a rescue) and three rescue cats. Her home is always filled with children, animals and kindness. She spends her weekends providing respite for parents of DD children who have no one else to turn to. She is a continual facet of care and support where there would otherwise be a vacuum.

Even while vacationing, Eva's spirit of giving shines through. On a recent trip to Hawaii, Eva noticed children at a neighborhood park were playing basketball with a hoop-less rim. Eva purchased new hoops for the rims, climbed up to install them, and then played several vigorous games with the local youth.

Eva Robinson has devoted her life to people who are in great need of help and understanding. She demonstrates outstanding virtue and leadership by helping children through her foster care. And she inspires greatness in our local community, by devoting her life to the DD population in King County.
