A Grant from ECA

We have been very fortunate throughout the years to have a wonderful relationship with an organization called Eastside Community Aid Thrift Shop. They operate a thrift store in Kirkland. They are a non-profit, all-volunteer Eastside thrift store that aids various non-profits throughout King County. ECA has donated over \$1.6 million in cash and \$1 million in material donations given to Eastside charities. They donate grants and goods to local charities.

We, have been fortunate enough to have been awarded a grant through their grant programming.

We will be using this grant money on a new accessible vehicle. Currently, we own and operate two large Sprinter vans. These vans are all several years old. The costly repairs have taken a serious toll on the money we are able to provide for our residents. We are in the market for a new smaller passenger van that

has accessibility features. This will make it easier for more staff to be able to provide transportation for various residents to appointments, jobs and other activities in the community. We are grateful to ECA and will continue to foster our relationship with this wonderful organization.
